Rotary International offers the following awards to recognize the efforts and contributions of Rotarians, and Rotary clubs. Eligible nominators may submit nominations according to each award's criteria/guidelines. Serving with the Committee Co-Chairs will be Governor Marlene Brown and all Assistant Governor's, CLUB PRESIDENT's, apply for as many awards as you like. Contact AG or Governor with questions.

- **All Clubs Eligible:** External Relations Best Cooperative Projects Awards - *recognizes clubs that conduct outstanding projects in cooperation with other local, national, or international organizations. District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted*
- **All Clubs Eligible: Membership Development & Extension Awards** - district-level certificate program recognizes membership growth in existing clubs, retention of current members, organization of new clubs. Recognizes Districts that meet membership goals. *District Governor awards from [form](#) submitted*
- **All Clubs Eligible: Newsletter/Public Relations Awards** - Recognizes clubs for outstanding media campaigns that improve Rotary's public image. *District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **All Clubs Eligible: Significant Achievement Awards** - Recognizes clubs for outstanding community service projects. *District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible – Exemplary Service Award:** To club whose record of services throughout the year sets an exemplary standard and model of excellence. Must earn RI Presidential Citation. At least one exemplary service project must be started, completed, or on-going during Rotary year. Must have achieved clubs Rotary Year goals. *District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted*
- **One Club of those eligible - Community Award:** For that club whose program of service made a significant impact on its local community or another community within the USA, fulfilling the ideals of the Object of Rotary's third element: application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian to personal, business, community life. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible - International Service:** For that club whose program has made the most significant impact on at least one community beyond USA borders in support of Object of Rotary's fourth element: advancement of international understanding, goodwill and professional leaders united in the ideal of service. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible- Vocational Service:** For that club whose program of service has best forwarded the ideal represented by the second element in the Object of Rotary: recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations: the dignifying by all Rotarians of their occupations as opportunities to serve society. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible- Club Service:** For that club whose success in building membership and/or developing enthusiasm for Rotary among its members best fulfills the ideals of the Object of Rotary's first element: development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service. Attendance and membership results are key areas. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible- The District 7150 Award for Innovation:** Presented to the club which had implemented a new service project within the last three years judged to represent a novel effective idea in the world of Rotary or within our local district. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **One Club of those eligible- The District 7150 Communication Award:** Presented to the club, which has created and maintained the most innovative and effective communication medium during the Rotary year. *District Governor/Committee award from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **All Clubs of those Eligible: Recognition of Smaller Club Membership Growth (for clubs)** This district-level award offers an incentive to clubs that fall below 20 members by recognizing challenges/achievements of small clubs. *District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **All Rotarians who are Eligible - The Rotary Foundation District Service Award (for Rotarians)** – for Rotarians who serve humanity through Foundation programs, this award recognizes their efforts. Each recipient is given a certificate, awarded at district level. *District Governor awards from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **All Clubs for those eligible - International Service Award for a Polio-Free World (for Rotarians)** : award established by Rotary Foundation Trustees to recognize outstanding contributions to polio eradication effort & encourage participation in final eradication work. *Awards Committee awards from [forms](#) submitted.*
- **All Clubs for those Rotarians Eligible: Club Rotarian of Excellence:** Recognition of a Rotarian from each club. This person is recommended by the club's Board of Director's. [Download form](#)
