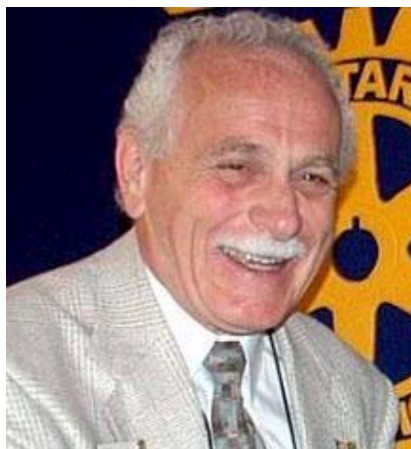

**Keep Rotarians engaged**

We all want our Rotary clubs to be the best they can be — engaging, fun, and effective. But how do you motivate members so that your club performs at its highest level?

First, you have to get their attention. When they're focusing on their smartphones, they aren't engaging as members of the group. During club meetings, create a technology-free zone by asking everyone to turn off their smartphones, tablets, and laptops. When we disconnect from our machines, we can connect to those around us. Now that you have members' attention, use these tips to help your club realize its full potential:

**1. Balance.** Friendship and professional development possibilities may bring in members, but it's the opportunity to make a difference that keeps them. Make sure your club offers opportunities for networking, fellowship, and service in equal measure. A balance of all three creates a healthy club.

**2. Inspire.** Use your leadership skills to inspire members to get involved. Pick a goal — increasing membership, starting a service project, raising Foundation contributions — and offer compelling reasons for pursuing it. Inspiration can come from many sources: Invite an expert from your community or a Rotary district or zone leader, or show a video from the Rotary Video Magazine collections.

**3. Unite.** Your community and the world need us now more than ever. Help members understand that by working together, we can accomplish

more than we could ever achieve individually. Examples of how our collective efforts are making the world a better place are highlighted in The Rotarian and Rotary's regional magazines, and on [www.rotary.org](http://www.rotary.org). Share a story at your next meeting.

**4. Appreciate.** Recognize individuals. If volunteers are paid with recognition, then you are the paymaster. Honor individual contributions. Make people feel valued. Present the certificates and gifts available from licensed Rotary vendors and on [shop.rotary.org](http://shop.rotary.org) to club members who have shown commitment to your club's success.

By taking these few steps, you'll be making an investment in your club leaders and, by extension, in the club itself. I've found that a little investment can to a long way.

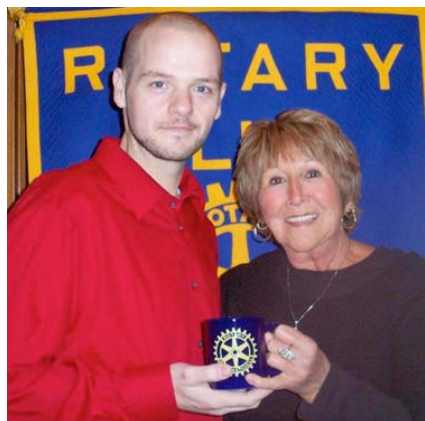
Jim spoke about Rotary's three areas of focus: projects to strengthen families; continuity as shown by the polio project; and embracing change, particularly by increasing membership.

Too many Americans don't have enough to eat. In 2009, the number reached 50 million, 17 million of whom were children. David Bobanick, executive director of [Rotary First Harvest, a Program of Rotary District 5030](#) in Washington State, is committed to shrinking those statistics. He is still haunted by the memory of a woman he helped years ago at a food pantry. She reminded him of his grandmother. "That did it for me," he says.

Since the program was founded in 1982 by the late Rotarians Norm Hillis and Mike Shanahan, of the Rotary Club of University District of Seattle, it has distributed more than 155 million pounds of surplus produce, donated by farmers, to hunger programs across Washington and throughout the United States. It has tapped into a vast network of food donors, truckers, warehouse workers, local pantries, volunteers, and partner organizations, such as AmeriCorps VISTA. The effort feeds hungry people while saving donors disposal, labor, and storage costs. Shanahan always knew the project worked because "Rotarians use their influence, and people identify with the good that is coming from it."

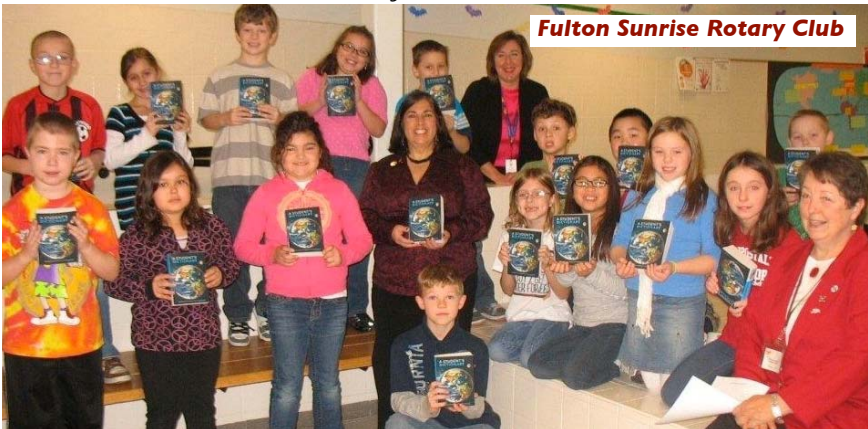
