He is a recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award. He has also received a Meritorious Service Award from *Rotary Down Under*.

## Rotary International Theme 2006-07



Rotary International's incoming president, William B. Boyd, has chosen *Lead the Way* as the theme for the 2006–07 Rotary year.

"This will be my theme and an affirmation of my belief in the power of Rotarians to change the world, one positive act at a time," he told incoming district governors at the International Assembly in San Diego, California, USA, on 17 February.

The challenge of finding a theme is that it must be short, inspirational, and translatable. Boyd doesn't remember the moment *Lead the Way* popped into his head. All he knows is that "it just felt right."

Since the governors-elect attend the International Assembly to learn more about becoming successful leaders in their districts, Boyd's theme was especially pertinent to the audience.

"In the coming year, I ask each of you to take your places as leaders in your districts and your communities," Boyd told the incoming governors. "I ask each of you to lead in the Rotary way, by living as role models of tolerance, unselfishness, and integrity. And because the best leaders have humility, I ask you to do all of this with friendliness and a smile, so that others will be happy to walk beside you."

Boyd concluded by saying, "As Rotarians, we are not content to let matters stay the way they have always been in our clubs or in our communities. We are not content with the status quo, and we do not look at a problem only to say someone else will solve it. We are the ones who ask, 'Why not us?' We are the ones with the skills and the desire to build a better future. And we are the ones who must *Lead the Way*."

**D**avid Linett is a Rotary International Director. He was elected at the Brisbane, Australia Convention and took office on July 1, 2004 for a two-year term.

A graduate of Yale College and Harvard Law School, Dave is a retired attorney. He served a five-year term as Somerset County, New Jersey USA Prosecutor and was the National Treasurer and member of the Executive Committee of the National District Attorneys Association. He also served a record twelve years as a Commissioner and Vice-Chair of the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission under three New Jersey State Governors and was elected twice to the Democratic State Committee of New Jersey. Active in the civic life of his community, Dave was named "Citizen of the Year" by the Somerset County Chamber of Commerce in 1989. He is listed in Who's Who in American Law and Who's Who in America.

A Rotarian since 1983, Dave was president of the Rotary Club of Somerville and Bridgewater, New Jersey and served as district governor of District 7510 in 1991-2. He has served in numerous positions in his district and in Zones 31-32. He is the founder and International Chair of The Rotary Leadership Institute, a multi-district program of 62 Rotary districts in all or parts of 19 countries and growing fast. Dave served as General Chairman of the 83 member R.I. Education and Training Task Force in 2001-2 and was Zone 32 Coordinator of the R.I. Membership Retention Task Force and a member of the R.I. Leadership Development and Training Committee in 2000-1. He was Editor of the Zones 31-32 Foundation Newsletter in 1998-2000 and was the Editor and columnist of the Director's Newsletters for those Zones from 2000-4. Dave was twice a delegate to the R.I. Council on Legislation. In 1998 Dave and his wife, Penny, participated in a National Immunization Day in Chandigarh, India.

Dave Linett is a recipient of the R.I. Service Above Self Award and the Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award. He is Vice-Chair of the Past R.I. President Rajendra K. Saboo Endowment Fund of The Rotary Foundation. Dave and his wife, Penny, live in Summit, New Jersey and have five children and six grandchildren. Penny, also a Rotarian, was a GSE Team Leader to Argentina and charter club secretary of the Rotary Club of Branchburg, New Jersey. Penny and Dave are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation.

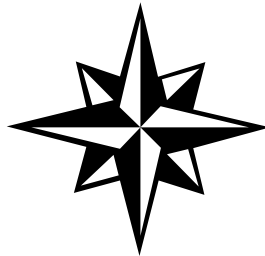
He was chair of the Northeast Multi-District PETS in 1999-2000 and was co-chair of the RI Multi-District PETS Alliance for two years.

In the Fall of 2005 Jim also drafted and submitted Matching Grant applications for a Nigeria WATER project, and a Guyana WATER Project. Matching Grant applications for a Honduras WATER Project and a Sudan WATER Project are also being prepared for submission in 2006.

Jim has continuous perfect attendance for the twenty-seven years since joining Canandaigua Rotary in 1979.

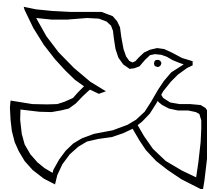
