Submit Your Centennial Project Honors by District Centennial Chair Marlene Brown



The goal of the **Rotary Centennial Project Honors** is to identify, recognize, honor and celebrate

the outstanding accomplishments of Rotarians, Rotary Clubs, Districts and Rotary Zones over the last 100 years and to select a finite number of activities for special recognition at the Zones 31 & 32 Celebration to be held October 7-10, 2004 at the Hyatt Regency located in Cambridge, Maryland. This also encourages Rotary Clubs & Districts to proudly publicize their service history.

All Rotary Clubs and Districts, in Zones 31 & 32, are invited to **submit a description of a service project** they completed and consider to be worthy of a Zone Honor. The service project may have been accomplished any time during the existence of the Rotary Club or District. The accumulation of these projects will help celebrate our 100 years of Rotary. Every Rotary club should review the history of service they have provided since their origin and submit the most significant to their district Centennial Com Chair.

A complete one-page description of the project must be provided, including the impact of the

project, duration and/or frequency.

The District Governor requests all ***nominations be sent to the District Centennial Chair, Marlene Brown*** at P. O. Box 83, Clark Mills, NY 13321 no later than July 1st, 2004.

The District Centennial Committee will select and send, by August 10, 2004, what it considers to be the top five accomplishments at the District or Club level to the Zones 31 & 32 Centennial Honors Committee. The Zone Honors Selection Committee will then rank the top three, in order, from each District's five nominees. The remaining two accomplishments will be awarded honorable mention. The three top accomplishments will be honored at the Zone Institute Oct 2004, as part of the Celebration of 100 years of Rotary in the Northeast.

The hope is the recognition will excite Rotarians and fill them with pride in their Rotary Club's accomplishments. These activities combined with other Centennial activities should guarantee Rotary's Centennial year will be truly memorable. 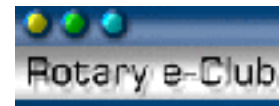
Stay tuned to the website of The Rotary eClub NY1 of D-7150 to not

CHOO! CHOO! That is the sound you will hear in June of 2005 when the Northeast Rotary Train chugs its way to the Centennial Conference in Chicago.

If we want to be assured decent **housing for the Centennial Convention**, we should reserve a block of rooms in our district's name. The cost of various hotels in the vicinity are available on our district website's Centennial page. You may also make your own reservations, but it is reported some hotels are already closed out, if we don't reserve a block soon, our district may be scattered all over Chicago. I hope many of you will set aside June 17-23 to Celebrate Rotary with others from the Northeast & around the world.

By federal law Amtrak cannot give take registrations until **11 months before departure date**, which would be July 26th.

Prices: The standard round trip price from Albany to Chicago, per person is \$250. highest to \$128. lowest, depending on availability.

Sleeper Cars -Standard 2-person room, \$299. highest to \$158. lowest, or Deluxe-2 person room, \$564. highest to \$291. lowest, both one way. Discounts apply for group of 20+.

Albany to Chicago train leaves Thursday, June 16, 2005 at 6:00pm and arrives Chicago Friday, June 17, 2005 at 8:00am. The return train leaves Chicago Thursday, June 23, 2005 at 7:20pm and arrives in Albany Friday, June 24, 2005 at 12:30 pm.

On to Chicago (via Amtrak) - June 10, 2004 UPDATE:

Convention Rate: Each person is responsible for calling, booking and paying for his/her own transportation. There is a maximum 10% discount for 20 or more people.

Amtrak has set up a **Special Convention Fare Code (X36D-919)** for Rotarians only. This means each Rotarian is responsible for calling, booking and paying for his or her own ticket. This will be for a "Guaranteed Seat" but not a "Reserved Seat".

There will be a 10% discount or a 15% Senior Citizen Discount, but not both. For all stations that accept checked bags (not all stations accept checked bags) all ticket holders are allowed three (3) checked bags weighing less than 50 pounds each and two (2) carry-ons.

The rules and regulations for making reservations with Amtrak follow. Registration for going to Chicago opens July 18, 2004. However, registration for returning home does not open until July 24, 2004. This meets with the 11-month departure rule. After July 24, 2004 you will be able to book both going to Chicago and returning home.

The Special Amtrak Convention Fare Code has been activated for any and all trains in the USA from June 14, 2005 through June 26, 2005. The offer is valid with Sleepers, Business Class or First Class Seats, with payment of the full applicable accommodation charges.

District 7150 Awards Program Criteria by DG Andrea Ives

EXEMPLARY SERVICE

AWARD: To the club whose record of services throughout the year sets an exemplary standard & provides a model of excellence for other clubs.

* Must earn the RI Presidential Citation for balanced service

* At least one exemplary service project must be started, completed or on-going during the Rotary year

* Must have achieved all or nearly all of the Clubs Goals & Objectives for this Rotary Year. *(This is 1 singular award selected by the District Governor).*

AVENUE AWARDS: Awarded to clubs on the basis of excellence in a given Avenue of Service

COMMUNITY AWARDS: For that club whose program of service has made a significant impact on its local community or another community within the USA thereby fulfilling the ideals of the third element in the Object of Rotary: The application of the ideal of service by every Rotarian to personal, business, community life.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE:

For that club whose program has made the most significant impact on at least one community beyond the national borders of the USA in support of the forth element of the Object of Rotary: The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and professional leaders united in the ideal of service.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE: For that club whose program of service has best forwarded the ideal represented by the second element in the Object of Rotary: The recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations: and the dignifying by all Rotarians of their occupations as opportunities to serve society.

CLUB SERVICE: For that club whose success in building membership and/or developing enthusiasm for Rotary among its members best fulfills the ideals of the first element of the Object of Rotary: The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service.

Attendance & membership results are key areas of consideration.

THE DISTRICT 7150 AWARD FOR INNOVATION: Presented to the club which had implemented a

new service project within the last three years which is judged to represent a novel and effective idea either in the world of Rotary itself or within our local district boundaries.

THE DISTRICT 7150 COMMUNICATION AWARD: Presented to the club, which has created and maintained the most innovative and effective communication medium during the Rotary year.

CLUB ROTARIAN OF EXCELLENCE: New this year will be recognition of a Rotarian from each club in the district. This person is recommended by the Board of Director's of each club

Rotary Foundation and Annual Fund by DGN Jerry Gortner, Chair

During the past two years, I have had the opportunity to serve as your Foundation and Annual Fund chair. This gave me an insight into the great works our Foundation accomplishes and the millions it touches each year.

Over the past 22 months *you have gifted \$291,590.12 to our Foundation.* These dollars helped provide oral polio vaccine to over two billion children since 1985. You have been part of the \$111 Million pledged for 2002-05 to eradicate polio from our world.

Your Annual Fund gifts have helped: Bring a South Africa Group Study team to our district and send five D7150 professionals to South Africa for an enhanced understanding of our countries; One of our students be one of the first 70 World Peace Scholars in the World; Jason Hopkins, our current Ambassador Scholar study in Malta; our Syracuse Inner City club conduct a Hoops for Peace project for the inner city youth; gave our Adirondack Foothills club the opportunity to build a handi-

capped access ramp at the Remsen Depot; helped three District 7150 Rotarians travel to India and help immunize over one million children.

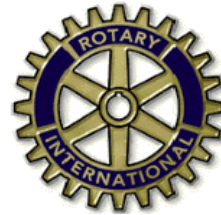
