About 50% of search and rescue activities are the Coast Guard's responsibility. On the civilian side of Coast Guard Activities are: Public Education and Water Safety.....Vessel Examination.....Search and Rescue. He pointed out that he is subject to military regulations when on duty. The Auxillary does basically education on water- they are not directly a law enforcement agency. Joe demonstrated two types of life jackets while pointing out that nationally, 85% of the drownings were the cause of not wearing a life jacket.
